MINUTE ORDER FOLLOWING JURY TRIAL

The Court finds that the named class representatives have proven the taking element of inverse condemnation against the Defendant City of Reno by a preponderance of the evidence. In support of this finding, the Court found credible and persuasive, the evidence that Defendants' use of the Reno-Stead Water Reclamation Facility (RSWRF) beyond its permitted use; the plan approval and acceptance of dedication process; the failure to account for the effect of increased effluent discharge if combined with a foreseeable severe storm event; and pumping through Moya Lift Station of sewerage from the Silver Lake Basin to RSWRF; together and/or

individually, resulted in a physical invasion of water on the Plaintiff class representatives' property.

The Court further finds persuasive that evidence of increased storm water discharge which resulted from Defendant's approval of continued development in the Silver Lake and Swan Lake Basins, without adequate mitigation, resulted in a physical invasion of water on the Plaintiff class representatives' property.

Evidence in support of the Court's findings in this regard is found within the testimony of Michael DeMartini, Janelle Thomas, Robert Zoncki, Clark Stoner, Dr. David Thompson, Jay Rosenthal, as well as the admissions of certain City of Reno testifying employees. This also includes the admitted exhibits referenced in their respective testimony.

The Court further finds that such physical invasion of water substantially interfered with the use and enjoyment of the named representative Plaintiffs' property. Ample evidence of this was introduced through the documentary evidence and related testimony of the named class Plaintiffs Johnsons, Robinson, and Walls, as well as Gladis Estrada. Further evidence of the barriers to access and/or enjoyment of property for a substantial period of time is also found within the testimony and related exhibits of Chief Sam Hicks, Chief Jeff Lytle, and many others.

The Court orders counsel for Plaintiffs' to prepare Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law (FFCL) consistent with this minute order. After circulating to Defendant's counsel for review as to form, a proposed version shall be submitted to the Court for entry no later than Friday, July 12, 2019. Defendant's counsel may lodge objections to the form of the FFCL as well. The Court will then review and enter an order as it deems appropriate.

The parties are further ordered to promptly set a status hearing in this matter. The Court prefers it to occur no later than July 26, 2019.

The parties are further ordered to meet and confer with Discovery Commissioner Wesley Ayres prior to the status hearing, to discuss a plan of discovery with respect to the damages phase of the trial. Such discovery shall be narrowly-tailored and focused.

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The parties are further ordered, pursuant to WDCR 6, to participate in a settlement conference no later than Thursday, November 7, 2019.
